## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

By setting up linked account access (individual-to-individual or individual-to-business/association) you have the ability to login and view, transfer funds, review statements, view checks that have cleared and other transaction history or perform other activities within Online Banking ("OLB"). To link accounts, you must be an owner or authorized signer on all accounts requested. You understand and agree that Billers and Scheduled payments set up on the linked account will no longer be accessible and you will need to set up bill payments for that linked account after the linking has been completed. Any pending payments will be deactivated and will not process. Account linking access will be set up within five (5) business days following the receipt of this authorization. The credit union will contact you by phone, email, or secure message within OLB should more information be needed. Please refer to Century Federal's Membership & Account Agreement and attached Disclosures for additional Terms and Conditions governing online banking services and activities. All Century Federal accounts, whether Individual and Business/Association, are subject to all rules and regulations as outlined in the Membership & Account Agreement disclosures.

By requesting linked access, you authorize Century Federal Credit Union to initiate online banking services in conjunction with the above individual and/or business account number(s). You also state that you: 1. read, understand and accept the disclosures regarding your use of the system and agree to comply with all requirements stated therein, 2. agree to use reasonable care in protecting your account information including the use of your security code(s), 3. understand that failure to comply with regulations outlined in the mentioned disclosures as well as any use of their system other than its intended purpose will be grounds for termination of this service and could result in additional prosecution and penalties allowed by law.
