After counting all of the mail in ballots along with those submitted at the event that evening the three incumbent Board members were re-elected. Immediately following the event the Board of Directors met and voted to retain Louis J. Ghosn as the Chairman of the Board and Diane F. Bridges as the Secretary of the Board.
